For the past 2.5 years Em has been in an "intensive language learning" period where she has dedicated most of her available time to the task. In May she finished an exam which got her to the level of proficiency recommended for missionaries to reach (not a "rule" but more of a guideline so that you have enough workable language to minister well). Would Em say she is fluent? Not quite! Is functioning in Portuguese super easy now? Nope. But she has made significant progress! The intensive learning phase has finished, but she'll still be chipping away at learning and improving, it really just takes time to learn a language well. The initial intensive formal language learning phase gives you the "bones" of language, but from there, you just keep living, making mistakes, and using what you've learnt to add more and more "flesh". # God working through his word

Our work with the University Bible Group (<u>GBU</u>) in Coimbra is a bible-based ministry. **As students sit under God's word through bible studies, bible talks and meeting one-to-one, we have the great joy of seeing lives transformed.** Here's a few ways we've seen God work through his word recently.



Duarte is a student whom Sam has been reading the bible with. **During his time in the GBU, Duarte has matured a lot in his faith and has become a committed member of his local church**. He graduates this year. Pray that Duarte would remain faithful to the Lord in this new season and be a blessing to his local church.



Alice is a student whom Em has been reading the bible with. **She is the only Christian that she knows of in her psychology course.** GBU Coimbra has provided her with a community of young Christians that have helped her remain faithful to following Jesus and witnessing him to those around her. Pray that God would keep growing Alice in her faith and witness.



As the academic year comes to an end, we farewelled a handful of GBU Coimbra students who graduate this year. At the farewell event (pictured), Isabela (second to the right), one of the graduating students, shared that through her years of involvement in GBU bible studies and bible talks, **God helped her to see "it is possible to remain firm in the word even through university".** Praise God for how he is using the ministry of the GBU to help young people remain firm in his word in such a formative stage of their lives.



Recently, Sam gave a talk on the topic of mental health at a youth meeting of a local church in Coimbra, and at the GBU's weekly public bible talk. 30% of university students in Portugal experience moderate to severe symptoms of anxiety. This topic is not understood well within churches in Portugal, is often treated with little empathy, and

leaves Christian who struggle with mental health issues feeling guilty about "not having enough faith". Greatly helped by excellent Christian resources from Australia on the topic, Sam presented how the gospel shapes our understanding, experience and treatment of mental health issues. It was encouraging that several people expressed thankfulness for addressing this subject.

### **GBU** Coimbra in our absence

In God's gracious answer to your prayers from our last newsletter, he has provided a substitute staff-worker for the GBU in Coimbra whilst we're in Australia on home assignment! Shane is an ECM missionary from Ireland who has been serving in Portugal for the past 3 years. He speaks Portuguese and will be moving into our apartment. Shane is a godly guy with a servant heart and great at connecting with students. We feel grateful and relieved! Sam is in the process of recruiting student leaders for the next academic year in Coimbra and handing things over to Shane.
