Returning To Portugal: What Stays the Same?.

- Colossians 1:28-29 is still the key bible verse which shapes the goal and
 method of our ministry in Portugal. That's why it's the one on our prayer card! "He
 (Jesus) is the one we proclaim, admonishing and teaching everyone with all wisdom,
 so that we may present everyone fully mature in Christ. To this end I strenuously
 content with all the energy Christ so powerfully works in me."
- We will still be working with the University Bible Group (GBU) in Coimbra, pastoring, training and teaching them from the bible. It remains a group of about 25 students that meet for regular bible studies, public bible talks, training and socials.
- We will still be living in the same apartment in Coimbra. Since marrying in 2020, we have not lived in the same place for more than a year, so we look forward to God willing, living in the same place for a few years! We look forward to building upon some of the relationships we've built with our neighbours and those in the community.

Returning To Portugal: What will be different?

- We will be moving to a church more local to us. The church we had been a part of was a 30 minutes drive through the mountains, which we were happy to do for a season as we wanted to support the new minister (our brother-in-law) as he started his role and revitalisation of the church. We think it is now time to part of a church in our local community, to be able to invite and bring along people around us. We need wisdom from God about which church to be a part of, as there are lot of factors to consider.
- Em will spend less time "formal" language learning, and more time on-the-ground with people and pursuing other projects. Em is now at an "advanced" level of Portuguese and will still be chipping away at improving her Portuguese, but this will be done more through living rather than in the classroom in formal lessons as it was previously. This frees her up to meet with GBU students more and have other projects. Having recognised her need for more support as a mum, Em will be prioritising seeking and facilitating community with other young mums.
- We will have another GBU staff-worker with us in Coimbra! Shane is the ECM
 missionary from Ireland that has worked as our substitute while we've been on
 Home Assignment. Shane will be staying on as a GBU staff-worker in Coimbra parttime, praise God! What a provision to have a trusted colleague to work alongside!
