


Click to watch June video update:



Olá precious prayer partners,

Last week, Sam's grandfather, Mário Tavares Ferreira, went to be with the Lord. Mário was a faithful servant of Jesus Christ and played a formative role in the spiritual life of Sam. Here is a reflection from Sam that was shared at his funeral held in Coimbra, Portugal;

"Mário Tavares Ferreira (1939–2025), servant of Jesus Christ. As for righteousness: a sinner, deserving of condemnation- yet in Christ, acquitted and heir to eternal life.

Death is an irresistible tragedy, defined by the French philosopher Luc Ferry, as an irreversible force that takes life in only one direction.

To use an illustration by Phillip Jensen (former Dean of St Andrew's Cathedral, Sydney), we are like cut flowers, with the appearance of life, but in truth, we are dead, cut. We may radiate beauty and release perfume, but before long, we begin to wither. The vibrant colours fade, petals fall, the water becomes foul, and what once was the sweet perfume of life will quickly turn into the truth: the stench of death.

We spend our lives in flower arrangements, trying to improve our colour and fragrance, anesthetising ourselves from the reality of our mortality, hoping that somehow the inevitable won't happen, that the irreversible might reverse.

But the truth is: the irreversible has been reversed. Two thousand years ago, Jesus came into this world and reversed the irreversible. He died and destroyed the one who holds the power of death, to set free those who live in fear of death.

Early on, my grandpa Mário understood his condition, his reality: he was dead and couldn't

resist death. Yesterday he proved it: he did not resist. And yet, his funeral is not a tragedy, for while he still had fragrance, he gave his life to the One who has the power to reverse the irreversible. And so, in full assurance and conviction, he could make his own the words of the Apostle Paul:

"Death has been swallowed up in victory. Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?

...But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ."

Mário Tavares Ferreira, born dead and died alive in Christ."

Every time she meets with Em she has already read and extensively annotated the passage! What an encouragement to see someone so thirsty to drink from God's living word. 

 We have noticed increased trust, respect and camaraderie amongst the staff this semester. We are seeing how the diversity can be leveraged to enrich the GBU ministry. With this increased trust, our input is being sought not only within our GBU group in Coimbra, but also in other GBU groups in Portugal. Praise God for this.

Summer Projects

With the academic year finishing, the long summer break starts! We have much less contact with students during this time as they go on holidays or go back to their cities or countries. We will be taking this opportunity to work on some summer projects that we'd love prayer for.

- 1. Writing a bible study series based on the book "God's Big Picture" by Vaughan Roberts. We have identified the critical need for Portuguese believers to grow in their biblical theology- understanding the bible as one story of salvation centred around Jesus. Our prayer is that this bible study series will help GBU students in this.
- 2. Writing a course to help students write and share their testimony. When we surveyed the GBU Coimbra students about what training they'd like to receive, the majority of them said training in how to share the gospel with their friends how encouraging is that!! Our desire with this course is that it would help students know and clearly articulate Jesus' story, their life story, and how those two stories connect
- 3. Getting to know the GBU groups in the cities of "Viseu" and "Guarda". The current GBU staff-worker of these cities (Sam's sister, Ana!) will soon be going on maternity leave and Sam will be interim staff-worker. These cities are about 1.5-2 hours away from Coimbra, and Sam's role will be remotely supporting the leaders of these groups by meeting with them online.



God's Big picture- the book we are working on writing a bible study series on. Excitingly, this book just got approval from the publishers to translate into European Portuguese!
